STAYING AWARE OF COVID THIS WINTER

Everyday signs of COVID are hard to spot now: few on the street wear masks, you don't have to show proof of immunization to enter public spaces. It's hard to know how many people have or get COVID, now that so much testing is done at home and not reported. Yet, COVID is still with us and we can expect a doubling of hospitalizations and ICU admissions by this year's end.

Those with other illnesses or live in group settings are more likely to get sick with COVID, be hospitalized, be put on a ventilator, or die from the disease.

CP leadership will closely monitor national and local COVID trends, infection rates, recommendations from health authorities, and developments in our settings. We will review and, if needed, update policies and procedures to better protect our community: those we serve, our colleagues, and families.

PUBLIC ENDORSEMENT OF UPDATED, FEDERAL DEFINITIONS OF DISABILITY

In response to the HHS request for public comments,
CP Unlimited submitted the below in service of a more accessible, equitable, and contemporary lens through which to create a world where people with intellectual and developmental disabilities can achieve fulfilling lives:

"The Executive Leadership of Constructive Partnerships (CP) Unlimited, supports the proposed amendment by HHS to Section 504. The clarified rules allow for a more equitable outlook towards persons with disabilities, ensuring that they are seen by medical providers with the same lens as other individuals, while expanding access to programs and defining standards for equipment that were previously lacking. Applying these parameters and guidelines, we also believe, will create a safer and more independent environment through which people with disabilities can achieve fulfilling lives..."
